### *The Vintage Years* - Movie Posters From Early Black Film January 16 - March 4, 2007

The Heritage Society (THS) is celebrating early African-American film by hosting *The Vintage Years: Movie Posters from the Early Years of Black Cinema*, an exhibition on loan from The Separate Cinema Archive. The exhibition will feature a rare and unique collection of movie posters highlighting performers such as Josephine Baker, Ethel Waters, and Billie Holliday, and films like *Hearts in Dixie*, *Stormy Weather* and *Porgy and Bess*. In conjunction with the exhibition, THS will partner with the Museum of Fine Arts, Houston on an African-American film series offered during the month of February 2007.
