SPIKE AT 20 - A Retrospective A Movie Poster Exhibition March 17 - April 20, 2008

In conjunction with the Vassar Africana Studies Department, the Vassar Film Department, and the Dean of the Faculty's Office, the Frances Lehman Loeb Art Center will exhibit *Spike at 20* - a retrospective poster exhibition of the works of director Spike Lee. On loan from The Separate Cinema Archive, the film posters chronicle the twenty-year journey of America's most prominent African-American director. From his feature length film debut *She's Gotta Have It* (1986) through his profound television documentary *When the Levees Broke* (2006), Spike Lee's provocative insight into social and political issues continues to redefine filmmaking.

The Frances Lehman Loeb Art Center, which is celebrating its 15th anniversary, was founded in 1864 as the Vassar College Art Gallery. The current 36,400 square foot facility, designed by Cesar Pelli and named after its primary donor, charts the history of art from antiquity to the present and comprises over 17,000 works, including paintings, sculptures, drawings, prints, photographs, and glass and ceramic wares.
